




BOND CASTLE was built on a property granted in 1649 by Cecil Calvert to Sir John Bond. The house had a cross plan, and dated from the late Seventeenth Century. This view is of the side toward the Bay



Pure English features were built into old BOND CASTLE, now destroyed. Among them were the overhanging peaked gables, the freestanding chimneys, and the turned spindles in the vestibule




EAST ELEVATION


