According to information prepared by SHA, the Thomas Crocket House, located at 1571 German Chapel Road, Prince Frederick vicinity, does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. The property consists of a large frame, cross gable farmhouse, constructed in 1913, with a two story projecting bay on the north side and the original decorative wood shingles in cross gable, and a late 1950s tobacco barn. Due to extensive alterations, the house fails to convey a strong sense of the turn-of-the century farmhouse. It is not located in any known historic district.

Two over two windows light the house. A half-circle window appears in the cross-gable. Sidelights and a transom surround the central entrance. Two central brick chimneys heat the house.








