According to information prepared by SHA, the Melvin Matteson House, located at 1850 Solomons Island Road, Prince Frederick vicinity, does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. The property consists of a simple frame I-house with ell, constructed in the 1910s or 1920s, and two tobacco barns constructed in the 1950s. The house has been subjected to numerous alterations and additions over the years and no longer has sufficient integrity to convey a sense of the original early 20th century farmhouse. It does not appear to embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction or possess high artistic value and has little integrity. The house is not located in any known historic district.








QUADRANGLE LOCATION


