The single story, wood-framed, gable fronted building is a single bay wide and three bays deep. The entry is centered in the east gable end and adjoins a recently constructed stoop. Six over six, double hung windows light the interior.

The single-story, front gabled, wood-framed building, is rectangular in plan, and is similar in size and plan to other one-room schoolhouses of the period in Calvert County. It is located on a flat, tree-shaded lot at the north edge of the Christ Church property on the east side of Broomes Island Road (Maryland Route 264). Available evidence indicates that the building is on its original site (Howard 1998).

The principal facade of the building faces east and is marked by a central six-panel, "Cross and Bible" wood door. Access to this door is by means of recently constructed wood steps leading to a rectangular stoop. This stoop and stairway is marked by wood newels with ball finials. The building is three bays deep with bays defined by regularly spaced, six over six, wood-framed windows. The rear elevation is blank.

The building is raised on rubble stone piers. Its walls are sheathed in German siding. The cornice is boxed with returns at the gable ends. The roof is sheathed with asphalt shingles made to resemble wood shingles. A brick chimney, partially parged, rises from the rear of the roof ridge.

The interior walls are sheathed in tongue and groove paneling. Window casings are ornamented with bullseye corner blocks. The single room interior has been restored as a classroom.

Significance:

The Port Republic School #7 is significant as the best-preserved example of a nineteenth century, one-room schoolhouse in Calvert County. Although other examples of one-room schoolhouses exist in the county, some are abandoned and deteriorated, while others have been substantially altered in conversion to residences. It is recommended eligible for the National Register at the local level of significance for its role in nineteenth and twentieth century education in the local community and as a typical, well-preserved example of a nineteenth century one-room school.

Available information suggests that the Port Republic School #7 was constructed in about 1866. Anecdotal evidence from the late Mr. James W. Brown indicated that it was known as the "old school" when he entered the first grade in 1886. The school remained in use until 1932 when school consolidation occurred, and children were required to attend school in Prince Frederick.

Pauline Williams Bennett described teaching at the Port Republic School in the 1910s:

I found reference books for the teacher and extra materials and books with colored illustrations for the pupils, also additional school supplies were on hand. The school was a frame building located near Christ Episcopal Church. The furnishings were simple and I assume similar to other schools....

Fortunately for me I knew most of the families whose children were in attendance. Many attended the same church, Christ Episcopal Church, as I did so I met them frequently. All of which made for better relations between the School, the children, Teachers and Parents (in Calvert Retired Teachers Association 1976).

Following the school's closure, it was used as the residence of two tenant farmers of Dorsey Gray, Sr., whose farm adjoins the property. Until the 1970s, the school had been abandoned for years, doorless and covered with poison ivy.

The school building was restored as a Bicentennial project of the Calvert Retired Teachers Association. The restoration, funded by contributions from throughout the Calvert County community, included reshingling and repair of the roof, repair of windows, replacement of the door and the stove, and addition of period furnishings. The building was painted in 1985, and steps were replaced in the same year. Subsequent maintenance projects have included replacement of some siding and repairs to the roof.



Broomes Island Quadrangle




Green Tree
