This house faces east on Maryland Route 2/4. It was originally built between 1900 and 1920 as a two-bay two-story four-square dwelling with a central brick stove flue. In some later building campaign, it was extended by a two-story one-bay addition that included the rear ell. Both first- and second-period section have hipped roofs. There are original two-over-two double-hung sash. The hipped roof is finished with deep eaves. There is no cornice or other embellishment at this juncture. The facade of the house is now concealed by an enclosed one-story porch that is set on square concrete piers. There is also a one-story shed-roofed rear addition. The present foundation is poured concrete. The upper story of this house has been converted into an apartment.






