This early twentieth-century bungalow faces east onto Highway 2/4. It is a one-and-a-half-story, framed and weather-boarded, gable-roofed dwelling, the sort of bungalow that has the ridgeline running parallel to the facade. The low three-bay facade is concealed behind a screened-in porch. The doorway is located at the center of the facade. The house originally stood on concrete piers, but these have been filled in with concrete blocks. The windows have six-over-one double-hung sash. A brick chimney is located on the ridgeline near the center of the structure. A gabled dormer is located on both the front and rear faces of the roof. The roof is framed up with exposed rafter ends and deep eaves with no cornice. One or two of the original brackets still survive. There is a rear shed addition.




