This house faces north onto Armory Road at the southeast corner of the intersection with Dares Beach Road. This is an important house, because it is an almost untouched example of an early twentieth-century bungalow -- the side-facing gable variety. It is a one and a half story framed and weatherboarded gable-roofed structure with a two bay facade, composed of a side entrance and a bank of three windows. The original sash are six over one. There is an exterior brick chimney on the west gable end. There are three-bay, gabled dormers in the front and rear faces of the roof. The shed-roofed front porch is distinguished by brick piers and tapering wooden posts. There is a one-story one-room hipped addition on the west gable end. The deep eaves of the house are supported by corbelled wooden brackets.
