According to information prepared by SHA, the Thompson House #1 was constructed c. 1940 and does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. Although it is probably earlier than 1940, the bungalow is a common house type in the Prince Frederick and this simple, frame bungalow is not a particularly noteworthy or distinguished example. Thus, it ~~does not~~ not embody distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction or possess high artistic values. It is not located in any known historic district.

This house faces south onto Armory Road. It is a side-gable bungalow, a one-and-a-half-story, framed and weather-boarded house with a three-bay facade and a side-passage plan. The windows have six-over-one double-hung sash. The shed-roofed, screened-in front porch is plainly framed with two-by-four studs and matchboard siding. The roof is constructed with exposed rafter ends and a gabled dormer that faces front. The deep eaves are supported by plain up-brace brackets. There are brick stove flues on the back face of the roof. The roof is covered with standing-seam sheet-metal. There is a rear shed addition and a one-story, one-bay extension on the east gable end.
