This house faces west onto Maryland Route 765. It is an early twentieth-century Colonial Revival house. Set on a concrete foundation, it is a two-story double-pile side-passage-parlor-plan framed and weatherboarded house with a central brick chimney and a gable roof covered with standing-seam sheet metal. The windows have six-over-six double-hung sash. The main entrance is unembellished except for an added aluminum awning. There is a one-story shed addition on the north gable-end wall. The original siding has been replaced by asbestos shingles.




