

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

According to Mrs. Martha Keets, daughter of Joseph Smith, her father built this house himself before she was born, but after he was married. Mr. Smith married in 1900 and Mrs. Keets was born in 1908.

When Mr. Smith bought the land, there was a one-room log cabin on it, Mrs. Keets believes that it was on the site of the present summer house. That cabin was demolished after Mr. Smith built his new house. It, too, was of log construction. It is two stories high, three bays wide, and one bay deep. The building measures 22'6" in length and 12'6" deep. A flu on the east end accommodated woodstoves. There are two rooms downstairs and two up. The house is capped with a gable-end metal roof. Glass lightening rods remain.

The front (S) windows are 2/2 while the back (N) windows are 6/6, and the windows on the west end are 4/4. Mrs. Keets says that 2/2 windows cost more than the others and her father could only afford them on the entrance side.

Two layers of clapboards hide the fact that this house is made of notched logs which Mrs. Keets says were filled on the property. That the house was planned as a two-story log structure makes it somewhat unusual in terms of other log structures thus far recorded in Calvert County.



Mrs. Keets was a girl and living in this house in the 1920's when an epidemic of flu caused many of her neighbors to die. She remembers that very few families escaped losing at least one member, and that her church at Barstow (demolished) held as many as four funerals a day during that period. Her mother tied bags of onions around the children's necks and made them wear them even to school. Mrs. Keets says that her family did not lose anyone to the flu.







BASE MAP CONSTRUCTED 3-18-70
