This house faces southeast onto a cove off Back Creek. Set on a brick foundation, it is a two-story, single-pile framed and weatherboarded house. The first-story fenestration is composed of two doors and three windows. The second story facade has four windows. Although the original siding has been replaced with asbestos shingles, it is clear that this house was built in two or three sections. An original one-room two-story three-bay dwelling was extended by the addition of a two-story two-bay section. The original exterior gable-end brick chimney was transformed into a central chimney by this addition. At the same time, or during some later building campaign, a two-story two-bay-long rear ell with an exterior brick chimney was added. The gable roof of the main section of the house is distinguished by two front-facing gables. The original window sash are two over two. A hipped-roof one-story screened-in porch supported on plain wooden piers shelters the facade. The central bay of this porch is emphasized by a small pediment.




