DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The farm at Ventnor is in good condition with many outbuildings still in use. The main house is two stories high, three bays wide and one deep in its front (N) section with a telescoping wings of at least three sections to the rear (S). It is covered with horizontal overlap clapboard and has a metal gable-end roof. There are chimneys for wood stoves in each section of the house. The original chimney and fireplace have been altered.

The floor plan in the oldest portion is essentially end hall and double parlor. Beneath the floor, one can see both hand hewn and sawed joists.

Much of the interior is original including the floors hardware etc. Of particular interest are the wooden locks on several doors. Ventnor has always been in the same family and several large pieces of furniture are said to have always been in the house. Among these is the piano built by Knabe and Gable in Baltimore; it is said that they were popular in this county.

Off of the southwest corner of the house is a complex of buildings which includes a garage, work shop, meat house, chicken house, and corn house. The oldest of these, and perhaps the most interesting is the meathouse. It is 10'4" wide and 12'3" deep (exterior measurements) and is covered with overlapping clapboards some of which are 17" wide. Like the main house and several other buildings, the meat house siding is said to be white pine. It is nailed to a mortise and tenon hewn beam frame. These buildings have been kept well painted and appear to have always been cream-yellow in color.

On the door of the meat house, there is an unusual double lock made of wood which is opened by turning a large metal key in opposite directions.

The privy is located on the other side of the yard from these buildings off of the southeast corner of the house.

Behind (S) the complex of outbuildings is a combination carriage house and grain storage. Although it is presently used for drying tobacco, this building still contains eight stalls for horses and a room large enough for two wagons or carriages. It is now occupied by a 1929 Chevrolet pick-up truck. Mrs. Fonner interviewed Kate Smith (who was eighty years old when she died C. 1930) many times about the history of the farm. Based on that knowledge, she dates the carriage house C. 1890.

There is a low lying meadow behind (S) the buildings thus far described and in it are two more buildings. A dirt road leads from the main house to the tenant house. It dates from C. 1924 but has been vacant since 1943 and it is in near ruins.

The other building is a large 40' x 40' tobacco barn. It is one of the few which did not blow down in that area during a bad storm in 1924.




Tenant House Sect. 91




