The one-and-a-half story, four bay wide by three bay deep, side-gabled Bait and Tackle Shop is located in Solomons, Calvert County, Maryland. The building sits in the floodplain on a narrow man-made causeway connecting Solomon's Island to the peninsula at Johnstown. The shop is in fair condition and retains integrity of location, setting, feeling and association. It is not recommended eligible for listing on the State or National Registers of Historic Places.

The property is located on a relatively flat, level site adjoined to the north by a restaurant, the east by the Narrows, the south by a parking lot, and west by Solomon's Island Road South. Across the road is a public parking area which abuts Patuxent River.

There is little historic information available on the Bait and Tackle Shop. It was constructed in the mid-1920s as a bait and tackle shop serving the H.M. Woodburn Co. charter boat business, a use it has maintained to this day. The building has undergone several additions and alterations, but the general form of the original building is still evident.

SUMMARY

The one-and-a-half story, four bay wide by three bay deep, side-gabled Bait and Tackle Shop is located in Solomons, Calvert County, Maryland. The building sits in the floodplain on a narrow man-made causeway connecting Solomon's Island to the peninsula at Johnstown. The shop is in fair condition and retains integrity of location, setting, feeling and association. It is not recommended eligible for listing on the State or National Registers of Historic Places.

The property is located on a relatively flat, level site adjoined to the north by a restaurant, the east by the Narrows, the south by a parking lot, and west by Solomon's Island Road South. Across the road is a public parking area which abuts Patuxent River.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Bait and Tackle Shop is a one-and-a-half story bungalow measuring four bays wide and three bays deep. It is clad in vinyl siding and capped with an asphalt shingle roof (Photographs 1 and 2). The building retains traces of its initial design, namely the front entryway inset beneath the overhanging front roof, the rusticated concrete block foundation and piers, and the tapered posts. At the front elevation, the façade has been modified; former front porch has been modified and infilled to create additional entrances to the Bait and Tackle shop, and an exterior window for the ice cream shop. The ceiling for the overhang is clad with beaded soffit board. Fenestration at the first story is a mix of vinyl one-by-one sliding windows, four-over-four vinyl replacement windows, and one-over-one vinyl replacement windows. Doors at the façade are also mixed and include single-light metal, utilitarian steel, and a Craftsman-style nine-lighted wood-paneled door. A four-bay shed-roofed dormer pierces the roof fenestrated by single and paired one-over-one double hung wood sash windows flanked by decorative vinyl shutters.

The rear elevation is dominated by a full-width one-story shed-roofed addition at the first-level which rests upon concrete block piers (Photograph 3). This addition is clad in vinyl siding and capped with an asphalt shingle roof, while fenestration consists of a mix of one-over-one double-hung wood windows and vinyl replacement windows. A single-light paneled steel egress door is located at the southeast corner of the façade. A raised wooden porch occupies the southeast corner of the building. There is a four bay shed-roofed dormer projecting from the rear roofline which is fenestrated within one-over-one double-hung vinyl replacement windows. An off-center brick chimney pierces the dormer's roofline at the eaves.

The south elevation is three bays wide, clad with vinyl siding, and covered by deep eaves (Photograph 4). Fenestration consists of mixed one-over-one vinyl and wood double-hung windows, and a paneled single-light steel door provides access to the second story. A modern wooden stair leads to an aluminum awning covered second-story deck, both of which are supported by full-height wooden posts. Alterations to the vinyl siding is visible in the south elevation, indicating the former presence of a window at this elevation. The north elevation is not accessible; however, visible elements included one-over-one double-hung wood sash windows protected by aluminum storm windows and deep eaves, and vinyl siding (Photograph 1).

Interior

The first-floor interior of the building is generally open in plan (Photographs 5 through 7). Few load-bearing walls exist and massive timber beams and posts serve to support the second story. Partition walls have been installed to arrange the space for presenting merchandise and creating storage and office areas. The rectangular main block of the building is divided into three sections. The main section is largely a single open span showroom covering the southern three-quarters of the footprint, while the northern two sections split the main block into two rooms. To the east, the long shed-roofed addition is split into several sections. The southern section opens directly into the main showroom block, while the center section is cordoned off as a storage room/office space. The northern section of the east addition opens directly into the northeast room. The western expansions into the overhanging porch are similarly

divided. The southernmost expansion opens into the main block showroom as an ice cream shop, while the northernmost expansion opens into the northwest room.

The interior of the first floor consists of an eclectic mix of surface treatments and trims (Photographs 5 through 7). The ceiling varies from sheet-panel tin ceiling, to battened plywood sheets, to acoustical tile, to exposed floor joists for the second floor above. Some of the structural support timbers for the second floor are cased in wood, while others remain exposed and undecorated. Wall treatments are difficult to discern in most cases due to the degree of shelving, peg board, and commercial storage racks obscuring their surface. However, the majority of the surface treatment appears to be drywall, though floor-to-ceiling beaded wainscoting is visible in some locations. Weatherboard was also observed as an interior wall treatment within some of the northern storage rooms. Floor treatments were also varied throughout the first floor space and included vinyl tile, thin wooden plank, plywood, and ceramic tile. Trims for the windows, doors, and flooring included simple utilitarian and commercially available modern varieties.

The second story is accessed from the interior via an L-shaped stairwell or via the exterior stairway on the south elevation. The second story is divided into six rooms with a main central north/south hallway. Early five-paneled wood doors separate the rooms. All of the surfaces within the rooms are roughly treated in the same materials (Photographs 8 through 10). The ceilings are typically clad with drywall, though occasional exposed framing is visible, revealing a framed dropped-ceiling framework, and the roof rafters above. Walls are drywall clad. The floor consists primarily of four-inch wood-plank flooring with large sections of plywood, and self-stick tile in areas. Trim is basic and simple with only minor ornamentation at the base (Photograph 10). A bathroom in the northeast corner contains a claw-foot bath tub, wall-mounted sink, and recent toilet fixture (Photograph 11). Access to attic space is provided by a beaded access door in one of the rooms.

Outbuildings

Ice Cream Shop

A one-story, three-bay wide, single-pile rectangular outbuilding, which was utilized as an ice cream shop, stands immediately to the rear of the main building (Photograph 12). This building is clad with vinyl siding and capped with a flat asphalt roof. Fenestration consists of a solitary double vinyl sliding window, while the centrally located steel entry includes a single light. A former window opening is boarded up at the west end of the front façade. Appended to the rear of the shed is a five-bay by one pile lean-to shed clad with vertical T1-11 siding, and capped with an asphalt shed roof (Photograph 13). Each of the five storage bays has a centrally-located entry door with a latch closure. A side-gabled frame, open-air storage area capped with a semi-translucent, corrugated fiberglass roof abuts the storage shed to the north. The roof structure is formed from pre-fabricated king-post trusses (Photograph 14).

SUMMARY

There is little historic information available on the Bait and Tackle Shop. It was constructed in the mid-1920s as a bait and tackle shop serving the H.M. Woodburn Co. charter boat business, a use it has maintained to this day. The building has undergone several additions and alterations, but the general form of the original building is still evident.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

Harry M. Woodburn (1868-1940) began the H.M. Woodburn and Son oyster packing company (also known as H.M. Woodburn and Co. and the H.M. Woodburn Oyster House), which operated from 1918-1943.¹ By 1923, enough oysters had been shucked and dumped overboard that pilings over the water had been created. Calvert County land records indicate that this land, described as "Woodburn's Oyster Field," was patented to Woodburn that same year (1923).² This area of 0.197 acres was located northwest of the Solomons Methodist Episcopal Church (now the Solomons United Methodist Church).³

Woodburn began a charter boat business in the marina there in the mid-1920s, likely around the same time he constructed the Bait and Tackle Shop building, which was formerly known as the H.M. Woodburn Co. store.⁴ Woodburn's son, Harry A. Woodburn (1899-1960), operated the enterprise until his death. H. A. Woodburn's daughter, Doris Woodburn Johnson (1925-2015), and her husband Jack Johnson took over the marina and chartering service in the 1960's, continuing her family's business and traditions.

In 1989, Claude L. "Bunky" Conner (1946-2008) and Kathy Conner took over operation of the marina and business, re-naming it Bunky's Charter Boats. The Conner family still owns the property.




FIRST FLOOR

This one-and-a-half-story framed and weatherboarded, side-gable bungalow faces west onto Solomons Island Road. The front porch is supported on a foundation of decoratively molded concrete blocks. The wooden porch piers taper, as is common on early twentieth century bungalow-type dwellings. The upper half story is lighted through windows set in long shed dormers on the front and rear of the structure. Windows have one-over-one double-hung sash. The fenestration of the structure has been altered in connection with the building's newer commercial uses. The southernmost one or two bays are still used for dwelling space. There is an off-center interior brick chimney on the rear of the house and an added exterior stair providing separate access to second-story living quarters.

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
