DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Although some alterations have been made, this house appears to be the one pictured in A Souvenir Book of Chesapeake Beach, Md., an advertisement printed C. 1910. The picture is identified as "Seytan-by-the-Bay".

This cottage is a curious combination of the bungalow style with such Victorian motifs as projecting bays, deep corniced pediments, and leaded glass windows. The bungalow was quite popular in America at this time and the large sloping roof which is peculiar to that style works very well in this instance, for Seytan-by-the-Bay occupies a sloping site with a rather steep slope. Chesapeake Beach, is a community, occupies several hills and valleys that are part of the same topography as Calvert Cliffs.

A large four columned porch from which the Chesapeake Bay can be seen, gives a rather deceiving picture of the actual size of the house. There are rooms downstairs and rooms upstairs. The characteristics, large dormer, a diamond shape window, and the windows of the projecting bay, provide light and air upstairs. The pedimented dormer and projection as well as the main roof all have deep cornices.

In the C. 1910 photograph, the house has clapboards on the outside. The porch is latticed in and vines over the projecting bay and part of the porch, all of which gives a very picturesque feeling.

The only alterations that tend to disrupt the original design are that the porch has been screened in and the lattice work replaced with block. An addition has been made in the rear (S).






