Circa 1793

This frame house in Hillsboro is an early survivor of the first houses to have been built in the town. It is a small two-bay, two-story dwelling which has the back of its chimney exposed on the west gable.

"Baynard Wilson sold this lot to George Wilson in 1799 for 120 $\frac{1}{2}$ which indicates that Baynard built a small frame house on it sometime between his purchase date of 1793 and the above sale date of 1799." (Horsey, E. F., Origins of Caroline County, Volume II.)

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Anderson Frame House is located on the north side of Maryland Alternate Route 404 in Hillsboro, Caroline County. The exterior facades have been altered, but the shape and structural characteristics indicate that the house is late eighteenth or early nineteenth century in date.

The house is constructed of frame and clapboard painted white with a brick chimney stack interior end on the west side of the gable roof. The main facade (south elevation) is two bays with a one story full length porch. The entrance is the eastern bay and has a 2/2 pane sash window above it. Both floors of the western bay on the main facade have wide 1/1 pane sash. The gable ends have 2/2 pane sash, and the west gable end has the exposed back of the fireplace on the first story. All of the windows have black louvered shutters. There is a four bay long rear wing with a brick chimney stack at the roof ridge approximately midway along the length of the addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Anderson Frame House, although altered in some details, shows the basic proportions, plan and style of one of the early forms of domestic architecture in Caroline County. The characteristics of this form are the two storys, single room plan with a gable end fireplace and doorway on the opposite side of the main facade. According to local residents, the Anderson Frame House is one of the earliest in the community.


