Circa 1780's

On a small unnamed side street in Hillsboro stands a small frame gambrel roof dwelling which was originally constructed on the north side of Alternate Route 404. It was moved to its present location about 1913 when it was replaced by a larger dwelling. It is a two bay long building with central entrance. Like the other gambrel roof in town, the upper shape has been elongated to overhang the lower shape.

The lot on which the house stood was leased by Elizabeth and Philemon Downes to James Curtis, Shoemaker, in 1784. He died three years later, but may have built this house before his death. (See Horsey, E. F. Origins of Caroline County, Volume II.)

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gambrel House is located on the west side of the alley in Hillsboro, Caroline County. Although it has been altered and probably moved, the exterior woodwork indicates that the house might have early nineteenth century origins.

The one and one-half story gambrel house is frame on a block foundation and has an asphalt shingle covering on its sides and over the lower portion of the roof. The main facade (east elevation) has a central entrance with a large 2/2 large pane sash window to each side. There is a one story full length porch with turned columns and recent flooring. On the lower part of the gambrel roof are 6/6 pane sash window dormers whose roofs are formed by the overhang from the upper section of the gambrel roof. These windows and the 6/6 pane sash on the second story windows on the gable end appear to be old. There is a centrally located brick stove flue stack on the roof. In the rear of the house is a one story addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Local sources state that the Gambrel House is an early Hillsboro structure. Several of the exterior features, mainly the shape of the roof and the appearance of some of the wood-work, indicate that this is true but a more thorough investigation of the structure is needed in order to find evidence that would confirm the early date of build.




