DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Robinson House is located on the south side of Maryland Route 302 approximately one mile from its intersection with Templeville Road, west of Templeville, Caroline County. The house is a representative style farmhouse probably built in the mid nineteenth century.

The two story house is frame construction that has recently been covered with aluminum siding. It has an interior end brick chimney stack at each gable end. The main facade (north elevation) is five bays with a central entrance and a one story, three bay entrance porch. The porch has turned columns and ornamental brackets. The other bays of this facade have 2/2 pane sash windows. The gable ends both have two small attic windows. The rear of the house has a one story service wing. The interior of the main section is two rooms with a narrow staircase in the partitions between the rooms. The service wing has a one room kitchen.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Robinson House is representative of the domestic farmhouse architecture during the mid-nineteenth century. Stylistically, it retains the symmetrical facade and floor plan of the Federal period house but in a less refined manner, as shown in this example by the reduction of the stair hall to a staircase enclosed by the partition walls of the rooms.


