DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gary Farm House is a large frame dwelling dating from the second or third quarter of the nineteenth century. It has an "L" plan consisting of two nearly equal size, two part dwellings. The front part is the most architectural with pilasters at the corners, in the manner of Greek Revival dwellings. The front part consists of a tall, two story, three bay long frame part with side entrance plus a lower two story wing, two bays wide adjacent the entrance. It is built on a brick foundation and covered with plain weatherboard. A porch, which formerly stood on its facade, has been removed and only its outline is visible.

Behind the lower of the two parts is a two bay long, two story section (two doors and three windows on the first story). Beyond it is a two bay long, one and one-half story section with two entrances and a single window on the first story. A porch extends across the facade of both aforesaid sections. Close to the back door is a meathouse and dairy, the latter covered with original riven oak clapboard.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Gary Farm House is significant architecturally as a combination of vernacular form with a few stylish details. It is very typical of mid-19th century farmhouses in Caroline County, although it is twice the size of most. Possibly the reason for the size is that it began life earlier in the nineteenth century with part of the back section and it was enlarged as the family grew and could afford more space.
