DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Buschkohler House is located on the east side of Maryland Route 480 or Main Street, one-half mile north of its intersection with Sunset Avenue, Greensboro. It is a three part frame dwelling composed of a three bay wide, two story section with side entrance; a two bay long, one and one-half story section and a similar wing at right angles thereto on the east. In addition on the north side is a section built in the 1960's.

Its interior has a good stair, typical of houses built between the 1860-80 period, in the stair hall with a living room on the south having a simple but attractive marblized mantel. North of the stair hall is a dining room with small enclosed stair in the northeast corner of the room. There is an early 19th century mantel typical of the 1820 period and other woodwork. The third section possesses the kitchen which has been altered as a modern 20th century kitchen.

North of the house is an original boundry stone bearing the initials of William Hughlett and the date 1769. Several such stones are located north and east of Greensboro where William Hughlett owned several tracts of land.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house is a good vernacular dwelling of the nineteenth century which has grown as the needs of the families have grown. It possesses many good original features including the mantel and stair of the later part as well as the same elements in the older part.

The site is also significant for the Hughlett Marker on the property. The marker is a very unusual and refined boundary marker for the period. William Hughlett was a gentleman of some means who later moved to Dorchester County and whose children moved to Talbot County and held such vast holding in the Trappe area along the Choptank River.


