When seen in about 1966, the frame house which stood on the site had suffered a severe fire. Enough remained, however, to give the impression that the dwelling was a well-built late Federal period house with open string stair and a good carved mantel. The form of the building was like several in the county with a two-story three-bay section attached to a one-story three-bay section. Behind the latter was a kitchen but the form had been lost in the blaze. Its plan consisted of a living room and stair hall in the tall part with dining room in the wing and kitchen behind.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This site was recorded in a field survey taken in 1970. The survey notes a two story frame ruin. The surviving evidence indicated the building had been of the Federal style, constructed c. 1820. Presently nothing remains of this ruin. It was north of the current Edwards farmhouse, within sight of the Benedictine School.
