DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The westernmost dwelling along the old road which passes through Linchester is a three part one and one-half story frame dwelling built upon a brick foundation. Its walls are covered with weather-board. All of the windows have 6/6 sash and louvered shutters on the first story. The facade is composed of a two bay long, one and one-half story section with one dormer and a small chimney within the northwest gable. At the corners of the building are bold pilasters, a carry over from the Greek Revival period which persisted in Caroline until after the Civil War. The entrance has sidelights and transom and its porch has pierced wood supports and facia, resembling cast iron work. On the southeast side of the taller part is another section of almost equal size, with two windows. It has a pilaster at the corner and a dormer on the roof and a brick chimney on the outside of the gable.

Behind the latter section is a third section set at right angles, three bays long with one dormer on the southwest side of its 'A' roof.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Schmick House is a well preserved small mid 19th century vernacular dwelling with architectural aspirations to grandeur with its bold pilasters. It is similar on the facade proportions to the Wroten house across the street, but completely in form is more closely akin to the Nagel farmhouse near Harmony.

The house was rented during part of the 20th century prior to 1954 when it was purchased from the estate of Clatie Trice. She had inherited it from her father in 1927. Her mother, Sarah Ann Hurley had purchased it from Jesse Hubbard prior to her death in 1889.


