A small frame dwelling 1 1/2 storys in height stood at this site prior to its destruction by fire in the mid 1970's. It was moved onto the site from elsewhere as it was resting upon block piers. It had a plan of two rooms with central stair hall. From its exterior appearance, it dated from around the first quarter of the nineteenth century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Framehouse on Ninetown Road was destroyed by a fire in the mid-1970's. The site is located on Ninetown Road approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from Maryland Route 312 north of Ridgely, Caroline County. A survey in the early 1970's determined that this house was of early nineteenth century construction, roughly 1800-1820. It was not on its original site, but had been moved to Ninetown Road in the early 1970's.

The house was a one and one-half story, five bay frame structure with beaded clapboards. It was on a new concrete block foundation and had block stove flue chimneys inside each gable end. The main facade had a symmetrical arrangement of a central doorway and four 6/6 pane sash windows. The roof was shingled and had two gabled dormers, also containing 6/6 sash windows. Single casements flanked the chimney flues on both gable ends. The interior had a central passageway with a room to either side.

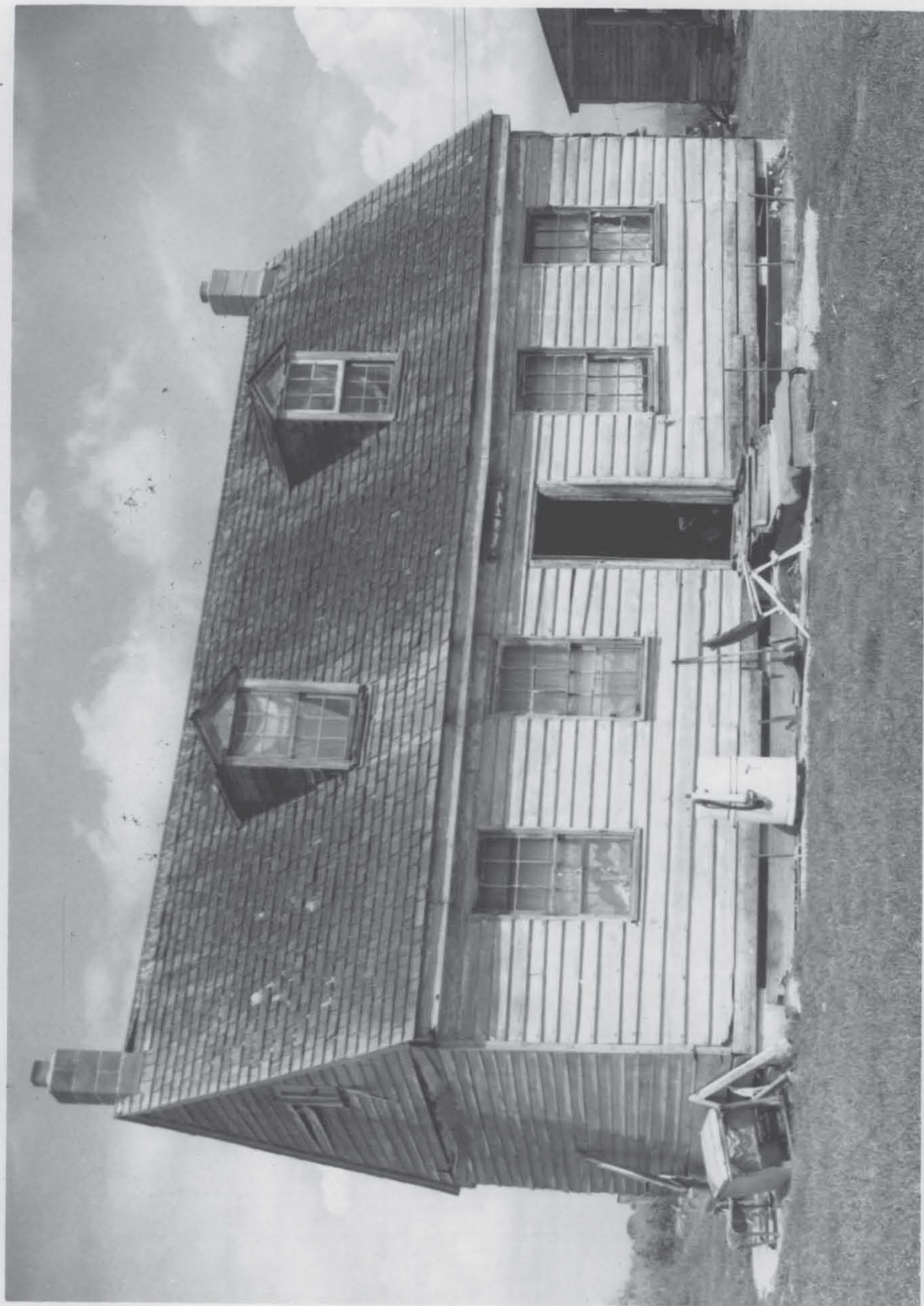

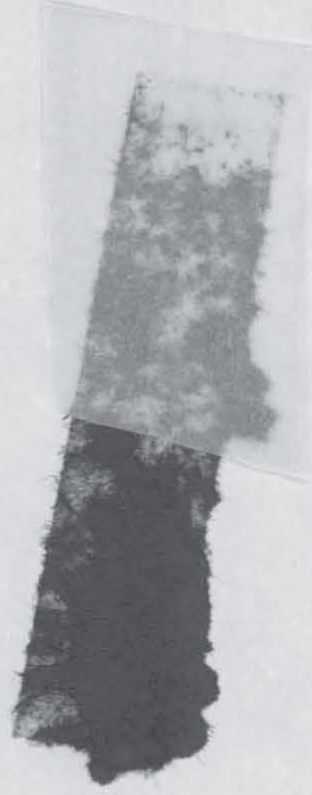
