Early 19th Century

Two miles south of Greensboro stands a large frame house set in a grove of tall shade trees near the road. The house is composed of two principal sections, one resembling a townhouse, 2 1/2 stories with two room deep plan and side hall, and the other being only two stories and one room deep. The early nineteenth century Federal style building was remodeled around the turn of this century, with the addition of gables and porches.

Adjacent the house to the north is an early outbuilding which appears to have been either a granary or stable.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Walter Schift Frame House is located on Maryland Route 313, approximately 1.8 miles north of Route 314 in the vicinity of Greensboro, Caroline County. The original section of the house is Federal style probably built around the 1830's.

A two and one-half story dwelling, the original section is three bays wide built on a brick foundation with no basement. This section has a side entrance plan with a chimney in the gable end opposite the entrance. A two story, two bay addition with an ell was added to the south side with its main facade receding from that of the original section. Therefore, the one story front porch of the house runs along the full length of the addition and along the exposed side of the gable end and part of the main facade of the original section, where its roof becomes a triangular pediment with its peak in line with the entrance. Above this pediment is a six pane window, while the windows in the other bays of the house are 2/2 pane sash. The main section has two gable dormers on each side of the gable roof. A double window gable dormer is on the addition. The wood cornice has a serpentine molding, and forms a pediment on the gable ends. Other ornamentation includes the turned columns and rounded, pierced brackets on the porch. The walls presently have an asbestos siding.

Behind the original section of the house is an outbuilding of some interest. It is a small one story frame shed on brick piers of a date comparable to or earlier than the original section of the house.

The Walter Schift Frame House is an example of an early to mid-nineteenth century house of vernacular character in Caroline County. Its basic form and shape derive from the Federal style, but the details of the original section and the alterations that have occurred have given it an essentially vernacular appearance.
