Homeland, southwest corner of Bank and Charles Streets, the White/Williamson House, was built ca. 1839. It was formerly the Methodsit Episcopal Church parsonage and was moved to its present site from a location on Main Street.


The historic resources contained within the Federalsburg Multiple Resource Area (CAR-285) represent aspects of the development resulting from the town's commercial and industrial growth from the mid-19th c. into the early 20th c. Federalsburg, an important Eastern Shore milling, shipbuilding, shipping, and industrial center located at the junction of river, rail, and road routes, experienced its greatest growth in the late 19th c. and early 20th c. This growth is clearly documented in the two districts [CAR-337 & CAR-338] and six individual buildings which have been described...The six individual buildings of National Register quality all have architectural and/or historical significance in Federalsburg's history.


