Thomas Connolly's house near Denton is a mid-19th Century frame farmhouse with vernacular form, but with Greek Revival details. At the corners were pilasters and there is a dentil cornice on all four sides of the building, creating pediments of the gables. A small porch tower in the center of the three bays is a later addition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Thomas Connelly Frame House is located on Maryland Route 474 approximately one-half mile south of Anthony, Caroline County. It is a mid-nineteenth century structure that shows some Greek Revival style influence.

The house is a two story frame house with clapboard siding. The three bay main facade has a central entrance with 2/2 pane windows in the other bays. There is a two story, one bay entrance porch which has an enclosed second story and flat roof. The roof of the porch and the main house has a dentil cornice which continues on all four sides of the house forming pediments on the gable ends. There is evidence that pilaster strips once existed at the corners of the house, but these have been removed. There are brick chimneys at both ends which partially protrude from the gable walls. There is also a one and one-half story frame addition on the north side of the house, with an asymmetrically placed doorway and 4/4 window in the first story and a four pane window under the eaves.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Thomas Connelly Frame House is an interesting example of house construction during the mid-nineteenth century. It shows the basic form found in earlier Caroline County houses but experiments with new types of ornamentation influenced by the Greek Revival style.


