Fourth Quarter 18th Century

Near Andersontown, southeast of Denton, stands a handsome 1 1/2 story brick dwelling in the midst of a farm. The main part is like Carroll House in the southern corner of the county except that the roof of the kitchen wing has the same ridge as the main part. Although in poor condition, the building retains original shutters and some paneling in the "hall." Its chimney is partially exposed on the gable, but lacks the multiple weatherings of the Carroll House. The building is a prime candidate for restoration.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Harry Nettle Brick House is located on Redden Road approximately one mile east of Maryland Route 474. It is a representative eighteenth century house in its architectural style and plan.

The original section of the house is a one and one-half story brick dwelling with a central entrance, three bay facade. The brick is laid in Flemish bond with tooled joints on the north and south facades and common bond on the east and west. The gable ends have pyramid chimney stacks partly exposed and 4/2 windows in the half story. The main facade windows have 6/6 sash, their original paneled shutters, and header lintels. There is a box cornice with a strip of molding above and below the box. The shingled roof has two four pane, flat roof dormers on the south side whose roofs extend to the ridge of the main roof.

The interior has a two room plan with plaster walls. There is a through passage provided by the doors in the middle bay of the north and south facades. The staircase is in the northwest corner of the house. The house also has a cellar whose exterior entrance is on the west gable end. There is a two bay clapboard addition on the east gable end.

There is an assortment of farm buildings on the property including a vertical board shed and a turn of the 19th century block dairy.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Harry Nettle Brick House is a significant example of the early form of brick architecture in Caroline County. The one and one-half story, three bay dwelling was a predominant form throughout most of the eighteenth century, but was quickly replaced by the Federal style towards the end of the century. The remote location of the Harry Nettle Brick House is a feature that indicates further historical research should be done before further assumptions to its date of build and significance can be made.






NORTH ELEVATION




"PARLOR" WEST ELEVATION
SCALE - 1/2" = 1'-0"





NORTH ELEVATION




FIRST FLOOR PLAN


