This handsome small brick dwelling is located east of the Smithville Pond in southern Caroline County. It appears to have been constructed in the late 18th Century as a "hall and parlor" plan dwelling. Its adjoining kitchen began life around 1840 as a 1 1/2 story frame structure. It was enlarged in the late 19th Century with an extra story and with porches on both sides. The latter have been removed and the house remodeled, but it still retains many of its early features, including the essential plan, but having the stair relocated and an arched cabinet moved to a corner position. Like Liden's Venture, there were originally exposed beaded ceiling joists and floor boards.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Bullock Brick House is located on the Smithville Road, approximately one-tenth of a mile south of Iron Gate Road in Smithville, Caroline County. The original section of the house was three bays to which a two bay frame addition was constructed.

The two story, three bay brick section of the house has interior gable end chimney stacks at both ends. The main facade is Flemish bond with a one brick belt course, while common bond is used elsewhere. The wood trim, shelf lintels, louvered shutters, and bracket cornice which continues around the house, is of a later period than that of the house, and the window sash has been replaced. The central entrance leads into a two room plan. The most notable feature of the interior is a semicircular glazed corner cabinet in the north room. There is also the original three part interior door trim. The kitchen has exposed beaded beams.

The two story, two bay frame addition has German siding and a dentil cornice.

Originally, the plan was like it is now except that the stair was enclosed within the southeast corner of the south room (Hall) and the cupboard, now the dining room corner cupboard was probably a cabinet in the wall of paneling which also enclosed the said stair case.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The original brick section of the Bullock Brick House is representative of domestic architecture during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century in Caroline County. This example is a country interpretation of the Federal style which has undergone some changes in ornamentation along with the addition of a frame wing.

Bullock Brick House retains many good features of the early house, especially the beaded joists and original cabinet.
