Circa 1810

Big Branch Farm is one of Caroline County's good telescopic dwellings with part dating from around 1810 and possibly part earlier. The tall brick section and middle frame part resemble in form and plan Oyster Creek Farm, Dorchester County. The stair ascends to the third story and is a handsome delicate Federal period stair. Similarly, the mantel in the living room is of interest for the fluting and gouge-work detail typical of the Federal dwellings on the Eastern Shore. Atypical to the house is a plaster medallion in the center of the ceiling and a plaster cornice.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Chezzum House is located on Payne Road, approximately one-half mile northeast of Maryland Route 331, east of Preston, Caroline County. The structure is built in three sections, of which the late eighteenth century Federal style brick section is the most significant.

The two frame sections are both one and one-half storys. The central section is four bays long with a two room plan. On the south side of it is a two bay, one room kitchen. It is undetermined whether these were built as service wings to the house, or whether they are earlier structures.

The two story brick section is three bays wide and one room deep. The main facade (west elevation) is Flemish bond while the other sides are common bond. It has a side entrance plan with the doorway in the south bay. The door has six panels and a four pane transom. The window sash has been replaced but the windows have flat arch lintels. The gable roof has interior end stacks at both ends, the south stack being a dummy. On the north gable end, two small 4/4 pane windows flank the chimney stack.

The interior stair hall has a open string staircase with a paneled soffit and recessed paneling on the supporting wall. The staircase has a oval handrail on square balusters, with a half-round rail on the opposite wall. Other ornamentation includes shaped stair ends and turned drops from the bottom of the intermediate newel posts. The main soom has Federal style trim including a plaster cornice and ceiling modallion, a fluted and gougework wood mantelpiece, and paneled door surrounds.


