Circa 1858

Herring Hill is located near Exeter and is one of the attractive mid-19th Century dwellings of Federalburg. It is obvious from the placement of chimneys and irregular fenestration that the building was constructed in stages. A small portion may date from the early 19th Century but the remainder appears to be of circa 1860. The house is enhanced by the Greek Revival elements of pilasters and pediment as well as the Italianate brackets and fretwork porch.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Herring Hill is located on the east side of Maryland Route 630, approximately four-tenths of a mile south of Smithville Road, north of Federalsburg, Caroline County. The house was built in three sections and the prominent architectural features of the later section are mid-nineteenth century.

The earliest section of the house forms an ell to the later sections. The early section is two storys of frame construction and has a two room plan. There is an interior end brick chimney stack on the north gable end. The east facade has been remodeled but has a one story full length porch with an enclosed north bay, a central entrance, a modern window in the south bay, and two 6/6 pane windows on the second story.

The two story main section of the house was built in two parts one of four bays and one of three bays. There are brick chimney stacks at both ends of the four bay section and on the west gable end of the three bay section. Both sections are frame with white clapboards, green louvered shutters on 6/6 pane windows, and a heavy bracket cornice which forms a pediment at the gable end. There are pilaster strips at the corners and a one story porch running full length on both the north and south facades. Both porches have heavy bracket cornices similar to that on the main house and the north porch is screened in. The south porch has ornamental cut-out posts, while the north porch has turned posts. The interior has nice woodwork in the later sections with molded door frames that have bull's eye corner blocks and carved wood mantelpieces.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Herring Hill demonstrates the way in which houses were altered and added to in order to provide better accomodations and to keep up with architectural fashion. According to the owner, the dates of the various sections are: 1742 for the two room earliest section that is presently the ell wing; 1858 for the four bay main section; and 1860 for the final three bays. The transitional trim, passing from the Revival style to the early Victorian period is of particular interest in Herring Hill.


