1st Half 19th Century

The Garey House, prior to its destruction, stood on a small hillock in the middle of a field on Tuckahoe Neck. It was a frame building built in three sections, just as Long Point farm had been constructed. Its walls were covered with plain weatherboard and the windows had 6/6 sash and louvered shutters. The dormers in the wing had flat headed roofs extending from the ridge and 4/4 sash with panes set horizontally.

The form of the building consisted of a three bay long 2 1/2 story section with side entrance and the wings were both 2 bays long. Its plan was identical to Tuckahoe Acres, across the road, and possibly was the product of the same builder.

The main part had a living room and stair hall. The middle part had a partially enclosed stair opposite the fireplace. The rooms above had traces of vertical beaded board partitions. The kitchen had no stair and retained only a flue for the stove.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Garey House prior to its demolition stood on a small hill in the middle of a field on Tuckahoe Neck.

It was a completely frame building constructed upon a brick foundation and was built in three sections, just as Long Point Farm had been constructed. Its walls were covered with plain weatherboard and the windows had 6/6 sash and louvered shutters. The dormers in the wings had 4/4 sash set horizontally.

The form of the building consisted of a three bay long two and one-half story section with side entrance and the wings were both two bays long, one and one-half storys tall. Its plan was identical to Tuckahoe Acres across the road and possibly the product of the same craftsman.

The main part had a living room and stair hall, the stair having ball finials on the newels and intermediates.

In the middle room was a partially enclosed stair opposite the fireplace. Its room above had some traces of vertical beaded board walls. The exterior was covered with beaded weatherboard.

Only a flue remained in the kitchen for the heat source. It did not have a stair. On the back of this room as well as part of the middle room was a porch with part enclosed for a pantry.




