Adjacent the Douglas House in Preston is a small frame chapel built by the Douglasses as a Swedenborgian denomination church. It is a simple frame structure with "Gothic" windows (lancet arches) with a bell tower attached to a front corner of the gable facade. In composition, it is similar to a small Episcopal Chapel in Stockton, Worcester County.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Chapel of Epiphany is located on the south side of Maryland Route 331 in Preston, Caroline County. The nineteenth century structure is an Episcopal Church whose architectural design includes a notable bell tower and steeple.

The church is built in a rectangular plan with a square bell tower adjoining the northwest corner of the main section. The structure is frame and German siding on a brick foundation with a broad gable roof. The main facade (north elevation) is the gable end with three bays. There is a central entrance with double doors and a pointed arch transom. Above the entrance is a gable porch roof supported by triangular wood brackets and with a cross finial at the peak of the roof. Lancet windows are in the other bay and a small lancet ventilator is in the gable. There is also a molded wood water table and molded cornice. The bell tower is constructed in the same material but has thinner proportioned lancet windows. There is an open belfrey with a balustrade along four posts which support a tall octagonal steeple roof. Metal ornamentation is on the top of the steeple. The main section is five bays deep with lancet windows in all the bays except for the southernmost which has an entrance.

The interior is one large room with a vestibule. There are two sections of wood pews with a center aisle. The walls are plaster with a vertical board dado and molded chair rail. Three bays of the roof framing are exposed. The alter is recessed and has a pointed arch.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Chapel of Epiphany is a representative rectangular plan, gable facade church whose architectural character is enhanced and delicately balanced by its lofty bell tower. Although from some perspectives the design seems awkward, the associative value of the bell tower creates a effective display appropriate to church architecture in rural communities


