SUMMARY:

The Geist House had the characteristics of log house construction in this region from the early 19th century. It was a two-story log structure with a square plan. Later improvements to the house included enlargement of the windows to a Victorian style sash, a rear addition, and an early 20th century wrap-around porch. The structure was demolished in August 1984.

DESCRIPTION:

The Geist House was located on North Main Street in Hampstead on a lot between the First National Bank of Maryland, Hampstead branch, and Bob's Variety Store, and across Main Street from St. John's United Methodist Church. The house was constructed up close to the sidewalk in the tradition of small towns in this region.

The Geist House was a two story log structure with a roughly square plan. The logs were V-notches at the corners. Its exterior was covered with weatherboard. The main facade contained three bays with a side entrance. The structure was built on a fieldstone foundation. The gable roof had a molded cornice that returned at the corners. The house was apparently built in the early 19th century and had several alterations including enlargement of the windows, a late 19th century rear addition of two stores with a gable roof, and an early 20th century wrap-around porch.

The Geist House was representative of the log construction found in Carroll County's small towns during the early 19th century. It was built as a two-story, three by two bay log house with V-notched corner. This type of construction with a side hall plan was a popular middle class house type from the 1790s through the 1870s in this region.


