The Messiah United Methodist Church began as an Evangelical United Brethern congregation in the mid-19th century. Their first house of worship was the Mount Pleasant church built 1851-52 on the Taneytown Pike just east of Taneytown. In 1894, they relocated to the present site and constructed the church on Middle Street.

The Messiah United Methodist Church was originally a frame Gothic Revival style structure representative of rural ecclesiastical architecture in this region. Architectural characteristics typical of this style in rural areas include the gable front main facade, pointed arch windows, and the entrance in a corner tower with belfry. In 1959, the structure was remodeled and enclosed in brick, with several changes made that altered the original character of the structure.

Summary: The Messiah United Methodist Church was originally a frame Gothic Revival style structure representative of rural ecclesiastical architecture in this region. Architectural characteristics typical of this style in rural areas include the gable front main facade, pointed arch windows, and the entrance in a corner tower with belfry. In 1959, the structure was remodeled and enclosed in brick, with several changes made that altered the original character of the structure.

Description: The Messiah United Methodist Church is located at 25 Middle Street in Taneytown. A photograph in the September 1954 edition of "Bulletin of the Historical Society of Carroll County," shows the characteristics of its original construction. The building was of frame construction covered in weatherboard. It had a square corner tower with pointed arch entrance. The tower retains its hipped roof supporting an open belfry with octagonal spire. The gable front main facade had a large ornamental pointed arch window, flanked on each side by smaller pointed arch windows, and with a small pointed arch window in the gable.

In 1959, the church building was enlarged with substantial changes made to the main facade. The entrance was moved to the center of the gable front requiring the removal of part of the window. The entire structure was encased in brick with all of the other windows being altered -- the flanking windows were replaced by 8-over-8 sash windows, 6-over-6 windows were inserted on the second story, the gable was changed to a round-arch window, and the tower entrance was replaced with a window.

Summary: The Messiah United Methodist Church began as an Evangelical United Brethern congregation in the mid-19th century. Their first house of worship was the Mount Pleasant church built 1851-52 on the Taneytown Pike just east of Taneytown. In 1894, they relocated to the present site and constructed the church on Middle Street.

History: The Messiah United Methodist congregation dates to the mid-19th century when the Mount Pleasant United Brethern Church was founded. Their first house of worship was the Mount Pleasant church built 1851-52 on the Taneytown Pike just east of Taneytown. This site is where the Mount Pleasant U. B. cemetery is located.

In 1894, the congregation relocated to middle Street in Taneytown, where they constructed a Gothic Revival style structure, representative of rural ecclesiastical architecture in this region. Architectural characteristics typical of this style in rural areas include the gable front main facade, pointed arch windows, and the entrance in a corner tower with belfry and octagonal spire.

The church building was remodeled in 1959 in a manner that destroyed the Gothic Revival design of the original. In 1968, the church's name was changed due to a demoninational merger.
