This building was constructed by the Trustees of the Hampstead Bank probably in the fall of 1900. They chose a Victorian style storefront as their design for a banking structure. The building is marked by its wide bracket and dentil cornices, applied wood trim, storefront windows on the first story, and tall arched windows on the second story. The bank sold the building in 1916, and it was purchased in 1920 by the Hyson family who run a furniture store there today.

Situated on Main Street in Hampstead, the Hampstead Bank is a two story rectangular building of brick construction with uncut stone foundation. The roof is a sloping tin roof with one chimney. Just below the roof in the front is wooden ornamentation. The left side of the front of the building has a flat roofed porch, which used to be a balcony with a railing around it. The right side of the front of the building has wooden ornamentation above the front door and two windows. The windows above the ornamentation have rounded arches that are filled in with colored glass. The house has four entrances, including the door that leads into the top of the front porch. There is also an extra addition that is built onto the halls as additional living quarters. The addition is done in aluminum siding and was not part of the original building that was built around the turn of the century.

When John W. Murray died, his two daughters, Elizabeth and Laura, were joint executors of their father's estate. Just before his death, John W. Murray sold a 7,740 ft. lot for \$200.00 to Hampstead Bank on September 4, 1900 (92/302). The bank building was then built just after the turn of the century. Sixteen years later, Hampstead Bank moved up the street and the old building was sold to J. William Kelbaugh for \$2,195.00 on April 7, 1916 (128/488). J. William Kelbaugh then sold the building to Harry P. Hyson April 21, 1920 (136/217). Later the building was turned into a furniture store under the name Hyson Brothers Incorporated. August 5, 1974 the name was changed to H.B. Inc. (576/219) and is what it is today.


