The John L. Hoover House has the appearance of one of the older buildings in Hampstead. It is a two-story structure built in the regional farmhouse style. It is probably a log structure and retains early siding as indicated by its uneven appearance. At the rear is a brick ell with double tiered porch on the inner side -- another regional feature for Carroll County. During the 19th century, the house was owned by the Hoover family.

The John L. Hoover House has unusual characteristics in comparison to other Hampstead buildings. The exterior appearance is of an early building, perhaps an early 19th century house. The house is a 2 story, brick ell with a center front door. It is 3 bays wide by 2 bays the first floor has a porch which is across the full front of the house. The house has 2 interior and chimneys as well as a two story brick edition extending behind the house. It was probably of wood or log construction with uneven width wood siding covering it presently.

The architectural appearance of this structure would date it to the 19th century. It is difficult to trace it in the land records because of an Equity Court Case in the 1860's. On the 1862 Martenets map has John L. Hoover as the owner. In equity court case #809 it was sold at a Trustee's sale for settlement of the Hoover estate. In the 1877 atlas it has Catherine Hoover as owner.

Land Records 45/173 has Richard Zouch in 1875 selling to Lavinna M. Earhart. In record 55/249 it has Lavinna Earhart selling it to George Armacost for \$1937 March, 1881.


