149 Hoods Mill Road

Summary:

The house at 149 Hoods Mill Road appears perhaps to have been built as a duplex, possibly intended as worker housing for the nearby mill. Its six-bay design with two doors is unique in Carroll County. The gambrel roof is also unusual. The house appears to have been built in the early-twentieth century, and the use of the gambrel roof is rather unusual for Carroll County. At one time there was a coherent settlement around Hoods Mill, but many of these buildings have since disappeared.

Resource Count: 1

The house at 149 Hoods Mill Road is located on the north side of the road just north of the South Branch of the Patapsco River and just east of the Old Washington Road, near the southern border of Carroll County. The house faces south, toward the road, and is a two-story, six-bay frame structure. It has a CMU foundation, shakes on the south elevation, and aluminum siding on the other elevations. The gambrel roof has asphalt shingles and an east-west ridge. The first story of the south elevation has, from west to east, a 2/2 sash, a 15-light door, two 2/2 sash, a one-light over ? door, and a 2/2 sash. The second story has a 2/2 sash in the two end bays and the two center bays. There is a one-story, shed-roof porch with four battered columns and a vertical-board balustrade. The porch foundation is also CMU's. There are two interior brick chimneys, with corbelled caps, centered over the first-story doors.

The west elevation is two bays, with a 2/2 sash in the north bay of the first story. The foundation has two one-light sash and the gambrel end two 1/1 sash. The east elevation has wood hurricane doors on the south bay of the foundation. The first story has two 2/2 sash, and there are two 1/1 sash in the gambrel end. The north elevation has a later shed-roof addition centered on the first story. East of it is a 2/2 sash that has horizontal lights. The second story has three of these 2/2 sash with horizontal lights.




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
