Description

The Noah Hotzfelt House, named for its owner of 1916 and located on Old Manchester Road just north of its intersection with Brehm Road, is a two-story, frame, ell-shaped dwelling built in the late nineteenth century. The three bay wide entrance facade, with a centered entrance, is surmounted by a shingled cross gable at the roof level, interrupting the gable roof which parallels the plane of the east elevation. This cross gable has a round headed window and variously shaped shingles. The end gables on the south has one square window divided by a center mullion, whereas the north end gable has two windows with two-over-two lights. The fenestration, which is regular, is entirely replacement vinyl sash in the two main floors. The structure is clad in asbestos shingles.

An ell extends from the west elevation, continuing the plane of the north elevation. A full width porch extends the full width of the east entrance facade, turns the northeast corner, and continues across to the first bay of the ell to shelter a diamond window and secondary entrance to the ell. The ell has a gable roof perpendicular to the principal roof, and is composed of standing seam metal. The south elevation of the ell has been extended with a one-story, shed roofed addition which appears to have been an open porch built onto the ell, and then enclosed, as it is supported on a concrete block foundation unlike the rest of the structure.


A simple, one-story frame shed with a gable roof is located southwest of the dwelling immediately adjacent to Old Manchester Road. The standing seam metal roof, the pitch of which parallels the east elevation, has been extended on the west to provide an enclosed garage.

Significance

This very modest, frame, two-story dwelling is characteristic of countless examples of its type constructed throughout the United States in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. There are numerous examples of this type of structures along Old Manchester Road, interspersed with modern subdivisions which have proliferated in this area northeast of Westminster since mid-century.


**WESTMINSTER
