The property known as the Logue-Nelson Farm is primarily an early 20th-century farm complex located in a hollow between the Old Washington Road and MD 97, in the community of Fenby, in Carroll County, MD. The property is not considered eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The small Logue-Nelson Farm complex sits isolated amongst rolling, cultivated fields, and although the farmhouse, barn and associated buildings are primarily a product of the early 20th-century, an older 19th-century building was incorporated into the main dwelling on the site. The main dwelling appears as a 2-1/2-story five-bay brick dwelling with a two-story rear ell, all set upon a stone foundation and covered with a cross gable roof. The main block of the house, built ca. 1919 by John B. Nelson, a grain farmer and Fenby postmaster, is constructed to abut an existing, mid-19th-century two-story, two-room brick house built into the hillside. All of the farm buildings date from between 1919 and 1930, with the exception the springhouse which is in ruins.

The Logue-Nelson Farm is a well-preserved farm complex that evolved primarily under the ownership of local grain farmer and postmaster, John B. Nelson. The farm survives as a representative example of an early 20th-century Carroll County farm complex, and the individual buildings lack the distinction necessary to qualify them for listing on the National Register under Criterion C. While the property is associated with a locally known member of the small community of Fenby, this person, John B. Nelson is not individually significant as a either a farmer or postmaster. Further, the property is not known to have any associations with event significant to our past. Based upon this information, the farm is not eligible under Criteria A or B.

Description

The farm is located in a depression between Old Washington Road and MD 97 in the community of Fenby, located just south of Westminster, Maryland in Carroll County. It is primarily a twentieth century farm which was built by John B. Nelson, father of the present owner, between 1917 and 1930. The only building which existed on the site prior to his acquisition was a small, two story brick dwelling, two rooms down and two rooms up, which became the ell when the large two-story, five-fay main block was built onto the north end in 1919.

The original section faces east toward MD 97, and was located on a fifteen acre parcel acquired by William Logue for 112 dollars in 1848 (JH8/185). It was built into a slope on the southwest and north elevations, so that three stories are exposed above ground on the east side. A one story open porch is located on this side, whereas the porch on the west side has been enclosed. The family utilized the basement for a kitchen before the north part was added in 1919.

The interior of this south, original section has been altered with the addition of fiberboard paneling, enclosing of the fireplaces, etc. The rear or south room was converted to use as a kitchen.

The northern, 1919 section is a center hall, five bay by two bay block, with the gable roof and almost full width, one-story porch paralleling the east-west entrance facade. The principal entrance is located in the center bay and the fenestration is regular. A cross gable, which does not interrupt the cornice, is centered on this facade. Two small windows are located in each of the gable ends, and brick chimneys are located inside the end walls of both the newer section and the ell.

All of the farm buildings are in good condition with the exception of the stone springhouse, which is in ruins.

Significance

This well preserved farm is typical of the early-to-mid twentieth century farms that grew up in the rolling countryside of Carroll County on the outskirts of Westminster. Most of the farm buildings were constructed by John B. Nelson, who moved to the property in 1919. His father, William Burgess Nelson, settled in the area in the late nineteenth century. John B. Nelson originally lived on the farm located across Old Washington Road from the Logue-Nelson Farm. He was a grain farmer who reputedly was a Fenby postmaster for awhile.

The Fenby community originated in the twentieth century along MD 32 in the vicinity of the present Kate Wagner Road, and north of the intersection of MD 32 and Old Washington Road. With the intensive development of both sides of MD 32, with residential townhouse developments on the west side, and major educational institutions, like the high school and community college, on the east side, the historical character of the area has been largely obliterated. The Fenby identity currently resides in the area considerably south of the original nucleus, in the triangular area created by the intersections of MD 32, Short Lane Road and Old Washington Road, but the historical continuity of that area has been diluted by the construction of new houses and the replacement of a late nineteenth century dwelling with the YMCA.

The Logue-Nelson farm is located in a hollow just south of this triangular area.





WESTMINSTER QUADRANGLE


