The property known as the George R. Loque House is located southwest of Westminster in a sparsely populated area of Carroll County, MD. The property consists of a ruinous farm complex, including a late 19th-century farmhouse and several deteriorating agricultural buildings and domestic outbuildings. The property does not qualify for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The primary dwelling is a two-story, frame dwelling covered with a gable roof and featuring a central gable projection. A shed-roof porch extends across the front elevation which has four bays on the first story and three on the second story. Several deteriorating agricultural buildings are located north of the dwelling, including a small barn, a corncrib and probably a chicken house.

The dwelling and its associated resources lack the architectural integrity to qualify for listing on the National Register under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past, and is thus not eligible under Criteria A or B.

Description


This farm site, located southwest of Westminster in a sparsely populated area, is made up of a number of ruinous farm buildings and a simple, frame dwelling, two stories in height and four bays in width on the north facing, principal facade. It was built in 1905 according to the current owner. It is reached by means of a long farm road which extends southward from Arnold Road near its intersection with Poole Road. There are four bays on the first floor of this entrance facade, as two doors are located in the center bays. This undistinguished, early twentieth century dwelling lacks distinction, and the farm is in very poor condition.

Sheds, a corncrib, small barn and probably chicken house, all in varying states of disrepair, are located north of the dwelling.

Significance

The farmstead was probably built by George R. Logue in the first decade of the twentieth century. The modest, two-story, cross gable frame house is situated in the midst of largely decaying farm buildings in the rolling Carroll County countryside southeast of Westminster, Maryland. Of a common architectural type of the early twentieth century, it has no significance for its architecture or as an agricultural complex.




