Summary:

The house at 3014 Stone Road is located across the road from Pipe Creek Mill (Maus' then Wiest's, then Marker's Mill, CARR-102) and was probably originally associated with it. The house does not appear on the 1862 map, but may be one of the structures shown on the 1877 map, perhaps in conjunction with an adjacent blacksmith shop. The 1917 map does not show this or several other houses in the area, but the house was certainly standing by this time, even if it is not one of them shown on the 1877 map. The house is a typical, simple, late nineteenth- or early-twentieth century structure that, other than replacement siding, retains a great deal of integrity.

The house at 3014 Stone Road is located at the southern intersection of Stone Road and Mayberry Road, approximately 3½ miles east of Taneytown in northwest Carroll County, Maryland. The house faces northeast toward Stone Road and is a two-story, three-bay by two-bay structure with a rubble stone foundation, aluminum siding, and a gable roof with asphalt shingles and a northwest to southeast ridge. The northeast elevation on the first story has a six-panel door set east of center with a 2/2 sash on each side. There is a three-bay, one-story, shed-roof porch that has turned posts and jigsaw brackets. The second story has a 2/2 sash in each end bay. There is a box cornice with returns. On the southeast elevation, the first story has a shed-roof addition on the south bay. This addition is one-story with a standing-seam metal roof and it has a six-panel door on the southeast elevation and a 2/2 sash on the northeast elevation. This may actually be an original wing. The east bay of the southeast elevation has a 2/2 sash. The second story has two 2/2 sash and the gable end has two one-light sash. The northwest elevation has an exterior CMU chimney in the center. The first and second stories both have two 2/2 sash. The gable end has one light to the north and a vent to the west. The southwest elevation on the first story has two 2/2 sash with one 2/2 sash in the wing. The second story has nothing in the west bay and a 2/2 sash in the south bay.

About 125 feet southwest of the house is a poultry house with vertical board siding and a shed roof of corrugated metal that slopes to the southeast. There is a door on the southwest and northeast elevations and an opening on the northwest elevation.




