Summary:

The house at 3739 Kump Station Road is a log structure that was originally part of a farm. In tracing back the property on historic maps, it would appear that the house was owned by S. Wivel in 1862. He was probably the same Sam^l Wivel listed here in 1877. At this time most of the current Kump Station Road did not exist. The road ran from the turnpike east to the current Bert Koontz Road, then followed this road southward. The maps indicate a private drive from the intersection of these two roads to the east, beyond the Wivel house. Presumably, Wivel oriented his house to face south, and when the current Kump Station Road was created, by 1917, the road was placed to the north of the house. This would have necessitated re-orienting the house to the north, which could explain the alterations to the south wall. In 1917 the farm was 25 acres and was owned by Hezekiah [J.?] Honn. The house is unusual for its corner down braces, which pass completely through the horizontal logs of the walls.

The house at 3739 Kump Station Road is located on the south side of the road and faces north toward it. It is about 2¾ miles northeast of Taneytown in northwest Carroll County, Maryland. It is a two-story, three-bay by two-bay log structure with a parged foundation, aluminum siding, and a corrugated metal gable roof with an east-west ridge. There is an interior brick chimney on each end and a new exterior brick chimney on the west end. On the north elevation the first story has a central door with one light over two flat sunk octagonal panels with bolection mouldings. There is one 6/1 sash on each side. They have been altered and were originally 6/6. There is a one-story, three-bay porch with half-hip roof and asphalt shingles. It has square posts, with jigsaw brackets and a spindlework frieze. The porch deck is now concrete. The second story of the north elevation has three shorter 6/1 sash. There is a box cornice with returns. The east elevation has two 6/1 sash on the first story and two smaller 6/1 sash on the second story. The gable end has two four-light sash. The west elevation is the same as the east. There was formerly a porch on the south elevation, but it has now been rebuilt as a one-story, shed-roof addition. The house has a two-room plan divided by enclosed winder stairs that run from back to front. There is a hewn summer beam that runs east-west. The joists are also hewn, with a center tenon and peg into the summer beam. The ceiling was previously lathed and plastered. The logs are partly exposed on the interior. They are hewn on the sides. The southeast corner of the building has a vertical corner post. The logs are set into the post, but not pegged to it. This post has corner down braces that go all the way through the logs on the south elevation. It is not possible to determine how the loose ends of the logs are fastened to these corner braces. The south elevation on the first story has exposed logs now. There is a window opening in the east bay. The window frame is nailed to the log ends with cut nails. This south wall has some reused logs that have V-notch cornering, but the corner joints are no longer being used. There was apparently a doorway in the center of the south wall. The header is still in place, but the opening has now been infilled. The second floor joists rest between two logs on the south wall. There is a brick chimney and fireplace on the west end that has been repointed. The fire box, which is small, has been closed off. It has a splayed brick jack arch. The rafters are hewn on top and bottom and have a half-lap and peg at the ridge. The rafter feet have a birdsmouth cut that laps over a false plate attached to the floor in an unknown manner. The rafters have Roman numerals and support lath. The barn burned about 15 years ago.
