Based on the information provided by SHA, the J.W. Reinecke House, located at 836 Littlestown Pike does not appear to meet the National Register criteria for individual listing. The large, frame, two-and-one-half story dwelling appears to date to the end of the 19th century and exhibits several Queen Anne style embellishments. However, the house has been covered in vinyl siding and undoubtedly has lost other period details, including the front porch posts and railings. In addition, its setting is considerably diminished as it is located north of Westminster in the vicinity of the airport and light industrial and commercial facilities. Better examples of houses of this style and period remain in the area. Therefore, the property does not appear to be eligible under Criterion C. In addition, it is not known to have been associated with any significant event or person, and thus is unlikely to be eligible under Criteria A or B. Lastly, it is not located in any historic istrict.

The J.W. Reinecke House is located on the Littlestown Pike north of Westminster in an area which was formerly agricultural but which is becoming increasingly developed. Just north of the property is the Westminster Airport, and some light industrial complexes are located immediately west of the property along Kriders Church Road. A number of brick ramblers have been built on the same side (west) side of Littlestown Pike between the Reinecke House and Krider's Church Road. A modern convenience store is located immediately adjacent to the historic building to the north.

This large, two-and-one-half story dwelling, constructed near the end of the nineteenth century, is oriented to the east. The five bay wide entrance facade is unremarkable except for the semi-octagonal bay in the southernmost bay, and paired Queen Anne windows in the cross gable. This window ensemble is widely represented among the late nineteenth century dwellings of Westminster. The gable roof, which parallels the eastern face of the structure, is interrupted by two corbelled brick chimneys located near the peak inside each of the end walls. The fenestration is composed of two-over-two lights in all but the gable end windows at the attic level, which are one-over-one windows, and a horizontal window in the southernmost bay of the enclosed rear porch. The building is entirely clad with vinyl siding. A modern metal garage is located behind the structure.

A full width porch shelters the center entry on the east elevation. The projecting cross gable end is embellished by a pair of Queen Anne style windows, with the vertical architraves extended up to form brackets on the underside of the projecting upper section of the gable end.

A one story enclosed porch extends across most of the rear (west) elevation. The interior had been extensively remodelled, according to the owner. Interior finishes have been replaced by wood panelling and replacement moldings, and interior walls have been moved to allow for the construction of a large new kitchen.



The Reinecke House is a large dwelling located at the end of a string of mostly one-story brick ramblers in the stretch of Littlestown Pike between Kriders Church Road on the south and Meadow Branch Road on the north. This structure, with its couple of Queen Anne embellishments in the form of a semi-octagonal bay and paired gable end windows, undoubtedly lost considerable additional ornament when it was sheathed with vinyl siding, with the covering of raking cornices, soffits and all exterior features. As a result of this exterior sheathing, the lack of period outbuildings, the building of a convenience store immediately to the north, and extensive remodelling on the interior, this structure fails to convey a strong association with the past. It has lost integrity of setting as well as of materials.




Carroll County Tax Maps 38 and 39, Parcel 446 (of map 39)
