Summary:

The farm at 1046 Streaker Road is not identified on either the 1877 or the 1917 maps, and perhaps the mid-twentieth century structures on the site are the first. However, the wagon shed on the farm certainly dates to the nineteenth century. It is possible that this was originally a small tenant farm that later became owned-occupied, resulting in the demolition of most of the old tenant buildings and their replacement with more up-to-date and substantial structures. In any case, the house is scheduled to be moved and the rest of the buildings demolished to make way for new development. The wagon shed is typical of such structures in this region.

This farm is located at 1046 Streaker Road and consists of several late-twentieth-century buildings, and a wagon shed from the 19th century. The wagon shed has a corn crib on each side, with three rubble stone piers under each crib. The shed has vertical-board siding on the north and south, and horizontal siding on the east and west. It has a gable roof of inverted V-seam metal, with a north-south ridge. There is a shed-roof addition on the west side. The south elevation has an opening in the center, with doors to the cribs on each side. These doors are now missing. The crib door on the east side of the south elevation was apparently added later, as a horizontal mortised-and-tenoned-and-pegged member has been removed, and probably an up-brace, as well. The interior crib walls have vertical boards. The shed is built of a hewn braced, heavy-timber frame, with mortised-and-tenoned-and-pegged joints, and has $\frac{3}{4}$ -round log rafters that are mitered at the ridge and support lath. The west wall has vertical studs with horizontal siding, with gaps set between the boards. The east wall has a center post and vertical studs to the north, with horizontal siding with gaps, while the south half of this wall has a horizontal member in the center that is mortised and tenoned and pegged to the corner post and the center post. There is then vertical siding here. The west elevation on the interior, to the north, has a vertical-board door. The siding is wire nailed.

Also on the site are several CMU buildings. Most notable of which is a gambrel-roof barn with a milk room attached, and two concrete silos. It has 6/6 sash and German siding in the gambrel ends.






