Summary:

The Watson Lane Lime Kiln was probably located on the Joseph L. Haines Farm (CARR-256? or CARR-844?); a limestone quarry is shown near this location in 1877. A double kiln, it was probably leased to someone else to operate it, with the owner getting a percentage of the product to spread on his fields and the surplus sold to neighboring farmers and builders. Lime kilns of all sizes were once plentiful in Carroll County, but few survive today, and most are not of this good a condition. Two of note, which were both commercial operations, are the triple kiln on "Locust Grove" (CARR-956) and the double kiln on the old Fenby Farm (CARR-260).

The Watson Lane Lime Kiln is located at the intersection of McKinstry Mill Road and Watson Lane, just north of Route 75 and just north of Linwood. It is located on the north side of Watson Lane, is banked into a hill on the north, and faces south. It has a rubble stone wall, with two segmentally-arched openings at the base that have brick voissiors. Between the arched openings is a smaller corbelled opening with a lintel at the top, and apparently with nothing inside the opening. The west arched opening is 5 feet 5 inches wide. It is 5 feet 1 inch from the current ground line to the spring line of the arch, and 7 feet 2 inches to the top of the arch. The opening is 5 feet 6 inches deep, and the back wall is stone with an opening at the base of this back wall that is now filled-in with dirt and rubble. The east opening is 4 feet 9 inches wide. It is 5 feet 1 inch from the ground to the spring line, and 6 feet 11½ inches from the ground to the top of the arch. This opening is recessed 5 feet 10 inches. Much of the rear stone wall here has collapsed. There is an opening at the bottom of this rear wall that leads into the shaft of the kiln, which is red brick. The shaft appears to get narrower toward the bottom of the kiln. The kiln shaft has three regular header courses of brick between rowlock courses. On the east and west ends are rubble stone buttress walls that run north-south away from the kiln. Both kilns are partly overgrown and partly infilled. The west kiln is partly collapsed on the west side, while the east kiln seems to be completely intact. There is a quarry about 100 feet west of the kiln right along the road.






