Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Sloman House is a two-and-a-half story, three bay by two bay structure with barn ruins and two modern sheds used for storage of farm equipment.

House (1795-1800/1880-1900)

According to the owner, there is a log house in the southwest corner of the main block. The structure is 2 stories, two bays by one bay with a shed roof. The main block is 2-1/2 stories, vinyl sided, three bays by two bays with a metal gable roof parallel to the road and an exterior brick chimney on the west gable end. A one story, vinyl sided addition is affixed to the west elevation and a one story brick, enclosed porch with large exterior, brick fireplace chimney is located on the south elevation. A one story vinyl sided enclosed porch traverses the principal [north] elevation. One-over-one, wood double-hung sash are located on all elevations except the upper level gable ends which have two 4 lite wood windows.

Outbuildings (1880-1900/1970-1980)

West of the main house are the fieldstone foundation ruins of a barn which according to the owner was a five bay by three bay bank barn. The owner has erected a modern, metal tractor shed west of the ruins. Behind the modern building is a large frame outbuilding that was once used for poultry.

A one story asphalt shingle summer kitchen is located east of the main house. Three bays by two bays with six-over-six sash and arched surrounds; the summer kitchen has a metal gable roof parallel to the road and an exterior brick chimney which has been covered with stucco.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Sloman House is a rural vernacular farmhouse common to the Carroll County area. The alleged log structure has been greatly altered so that original fabric and form are no longer visible. The main block has also been extensively altered with exterior original fabric limited to the upper level gable windows. Except for the large frame poultry house and barn foundation ruins any original outbuildings have been demolished.

The Sloman House does not appear on either the 1862 Martenet Atlas or 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas. The 1916 Rand Mc Nally Atlas lists C.Therit as owner, which Mr. Sloman has verified.

Evaluation:

The Sloman property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to have been associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion C; the property is not a significant example of its type, design or manner of construction. There are more significant and intact examples within the project area.


