Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Murray House is a small rural vernacular I-house located on Maple Grove Road, southeast of Manchester and approximately 2 miles from the village of Maple Grove.

House (1865-1875)

The 2-1/2 story, vinyl-sided I-house is three bays by two bays and built into a slight bank. The metal gable roof with cornice returns is parallel to the road. Fenestration consists of one-over-one sash on all elevations except the first floor of the main [west] facade and east elevation. Built on a fieldstone foundation, the house has been enlarged by the construction of a one story vinyl-sided addition on the east elevation. Three bays by one bay, the structure is built on a cinder block foundation and has an exterior concrete block chimney on the north elevation. An enclosed porch traverses the main facade. Three bays by one bay, the vinyl-sided porch has a metal shed roof and one-over-one sash. The northern bay of the porch is slightly extended beyond the southern bay.

The Murray House is a rural vernacular house with no outbuildings. It is listed on the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas [owner - unclear].

Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1865-1875, the Murray House is not eligible for the National Register. The property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to have been associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion C; the property is not a significant example of its type, design or manner of construction. Alterations and additions have essentially destroyed its integrity and there are many more significant and intact examples of its form and period, many with associated outbuildings, within the project area and throughout the county.

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
