Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Walsh Farm complex is comprised of a house, barn, summer house, chicken house and several sheds. The farmstead dates from the late nineteenth century and is a working farm at the present time.

House (1890-1900)

The 2-1/2 story, brick Four-over-Four farmhouse is four bays by two bays with a metal gable roof parallel to the road, two lightning rods and an interior brick chimney on the west gable end. Fenestration is regular with one-over-one sash capped by arced brick lintels on all elevations. Cornice returns are evident and the brick course is common bond. A one story enclosed porch, four bays by one bay has been added to the principal [north] facade.

A contemporaneous, 2-1/2 story, brick ell is affixed to the south elevation. Two bays by three bays, it has a modern, enclosed gallery area on the west elevation. The addition forms a "T" with the main block and the metal gable roof with interior brick chimney on the south gable end is perpendicular to the ridge line of the main block. Fenestration is regular with one-over-one sash on all elevations.

A frame shed is affixed to the south elevation of the main block and the east elevation of the addition.

Summer Kitchen (1890-1900)

The 1-1/2 story summer kitchen is connected to the shed addition on the main block by a common roof. The structure is vinyl sided, one bay by two bays with a metal gable roof and an exterior brick chimney on the east elevation.

Barn (1890-1910)

The barn is a 2-1/2 story, six bay by three bay structure with metal gable roof parallel to the road and three lightning rods. The east and west elevations have been covered in metal sheet siding and the ramp [north] elevation retains the original frame fabric. A metal and cinder block, shed roof addition is affixed to the forebay [south] elevation. Modern ventilators are located on the gable elevations.

Outbuildings (1900-present)

Similar to CARR 1528 and CARR 595, several of the original outbuildings are separated from the main farm complex by a roadway [Brodbeck Road]. A frame combination carriage house/corn crib and frame tractor shed are located on the north side of Brodbeck road. Other outbuildings included several metal sheet and/or cinder block equipment sheds.

The Walsh Farm may have been part of the John Reed Farm but it is not clearly indicated on the 1862 Martenet Atlas, the 1877 Lake, Griffing and Stevenson Atlas and the 1916 Rand Mc Nally Atlas. The architecture, however, is consistent with other late nineteenth century structures in the Greenmount area so it is doubtful that any of the structures date from 1850-1870.

Evaluation:

Constructed circa 1890-1900, the Walsh Farm is not eligible for the National Register. The property is not eligible under Criterion A; no significant events historically or agriculturally have been determined to be associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion B; no persons significant in local, state or national history have been determined to have been associated with the property. The property is not eligible under Criterion C; the property is not a significant example of its type, design or manner of construction. There are more significant and intact examples within the project area.
