1364 Main Street, Hampstead Vicinity

Summary:

William Shubkagel was a farmer in the vicinity of Hampstead who, in 1876, owned an 88 acre farm, plus an unimproved 62 acre tract and a one-acre lot with a two-story log dwelling and a frame stable. The one-acre parcel was apparently the building at 1364 Main Street, and it can be clearly seen on both the 1862 map and the 1877 atlas of Hampstead. After Shubkagel's death, C.1893, his numerous properties were sold. This one was described as a half acre lot " ... improved with a comfortable and substantial Log Weatherboarded Two-story Dwelling ... " Being a log structure, it would typically date before 1862, as the earliest map of Hampstead building suggests. The existing building has 2/2 sash and a central gabled wall dormer with a lancet sash, features that were very popular in the 1880's and 1890's in Hampstead. The front porch is probably from the early twentieth century. However the bulk of the building is traditional in form and could easily be an earlier log structure that Shubkagel bought for a rental property. Whether he altered the windows and added the dormer, or whether the work was done by the purchaser in 1893 cannot be determined at this time, if indeed the log house survives; it may have been replaced in 1893. The 1862 map shows about 35 major buildings in Hampstead. Most of these are no longer standing, so any log structure that does survive from early Hampstead, before the building boom begun by the coming of the railroad in 1893, would be very significant.

The Shub Kagel-Tipton House is located at 1364 Main Street in Hampstead in northeastern Carroll County, Maryland. The house is located at the southwest corner of Main Street and Sullivan Alley and faces east toward Main Street. It is a 2 ½ story four bay by two bay wood structure with a Pennsylvania farmhouse plan and with a 2 story two bay by two bay L on the west. The house has a rubble-stone foundation; aluminum siding and a gable roof of asphalt shingles with a north/south ridge. The L has a gable roof with an east/west ridge. On the east elevation, the first story has two center entrances. Each door has one light over two belection moulded panels and there is a 2/2 sash with blinds on either side. There is a four bay 1 story porch with brick piers; square boxed posts and half hip roof with asphalt shingles. The second story has four 2/2 sash with blinds. There is a central gabled wall dormer with a lancet sash that has two lights over a wood vent. There is an interior brick chimney on both the north and south gable ends.

The north elevation has a 2/2 sash in the east bay on both the first and second stories and two 4-light sash in the gable end. The L is in the same plane as the main block and has two 2/2 sash on both the first and second stories. The south elevation has a 2/2 sash in the east bay of the first story and no openings on the second story. The gable end has two 4-light sash. There is an addition in the southwest corner of the house; part of which is one story and part is two stories. About 15 feet west of the house is a smokehouse. It is a 1 story one bay square wood structure with board and batten siding; a gable roof of asphalt shingles with an east/west ridge. There is a door on the south elevation. The property was purchased by Dianah Tipton, who one suspects probably never lived here, and shortly passed to William E.B. Tipton, who may have lived here. Tipton's widow sold the house in 1921 to Joseph Schaeffer, who may have been responsible for the porch.






