Summary:

The early history of the Sykes House is obscure due to a lack of records, which is unfortunate because the building seems to date before 1840, making it one of the earliest surviving structures in Hampstead. According to later deeds, this was the property of Nathaniel Sykes, and was sold by trustee Michael Sullivan to John Sykes in 1843, after the death of Nathaniel. At that time, there was a ½ acre lot with a house. Unfortunately, this deed is not recorded. Nor is there any record of the transaction amongst the Wills, Orphan's Court records, or Equity Court records. Orphan's Court records show that a John Sykes, Sr. died shortly after Nathaniel Sykes, and John Sykes' estate was placed in the hands of John Sykes, Jr. Whether this explains the lack of records is hard to say. Other Equity Court records show that a John Sykes was a clerk in the Hampstead store of Samuel Lamnot from at least 1840 to 1844, and was a shoemaker with a journeyman assistant in 1844. This must have been the younger John Sykes, as the elder died before 1844.

The Sykes House is located at 1136-38 Main Street in Hampstead in northeastern Carroll County, Maryland. The house is located on the west side of the street and faces east toward the street. It is a 2 story four bay by one bay wood structure with asbestos shingle siding and a gable roof of standing seam metal with a north/south ridge. There is an interior brick chimney in the center. On the east elevation, the first story has from south to north a door with one light over several panels; a 2/2 sash; another door with one light over several panels and another 2/2 sash. There is a 1 story four bay shed roof porch with standing seam metal and five square boxed posts. The second story has a 2/2 sash in the south/south center and between the north/north center bays. There is a wood box cornice. The north elevation has a 2/2 sash on the first story and no opening on the second story. There is a vent in the gable end. There is a shed roof wing attached to the west elevation that has a 2/2 sash on both the first and second stories of the north elevation. This wing has standing seam metal roofing. On the west elevation, the first story has a 2/2 sash to the north with an enclosed porch south of it and no opening to the south of the porch. The second story has a 2/2 sash in both the north and south bays. The north center bay has a small 1/1 sash and the south center bay has a 6-light casement window. The south elevation of the main block is identical to the north elevation. Contributing resources 1.

John Sykes seems to have been in constant financial trouble. In 1848, he turned the Sykes House over to trustees, and two years later it was sold to Elizabeth Armacost. This deed is also not recorded, but is alluded to in later deeds. Six months later the Armacosts sold the property to Mary Sykes, John's wife. The property is shown on the 1862 map. Given a second chance, John Sykes seems to have gotten his finances in order, as he and his wife retained the property until 1870. At that time, they sold it to Keziah Murray. A widow who was probably making this her home. It is a common pattern for the widows of farmers to move into town, in some instances building a new house for their self in the process. Nothing is known of Keziah Murray at this time, but this may be the same pattern. In this instance she bought an existing dwelling, and lived there until her death. The house remained in the Murray family until 1937, and seems to have had only minor changes on the exterior.
