

ABSTRACT

Milestone No. 58(61) is an original monument of 1766 at its original site, marking Mason and Dixon's 58th horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning point of their 230.228-mile West Line, longest of their survey lines run and marked during their 1763-68 commission to define the boundary between the English provinces of Maryland and Pennsylvania. As with all original West Line monuments, this milestone was quarried and carved in England, of oolitic limestone, cut to stand as a post about 3' above ground, with a rough-cut base of about 1' or more for securing below ground, and measuring about 12" square with a low pyramidal top. It is embellished with vertical fluting and horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, with fluted top planes rising about 2" to a centered apex. The distinguishing features are the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk into a plain shallow circle panel close to the top. Reset in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey to stand about 1 1/2' above ground, this milestone is now about 1' high, is slightly less than 12" square, is in very good condition, unaltered, firmly set and well protected. On the federal and state levels, it is significant primarily as one of a series of 135 original monuments still standing along the West Line, the boundary commonly known since Civil War times as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. Locally, as one of 18 original monuments marking the present Carroll/York county boundary (3 crownstones; 15 milestones), it is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these two counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. 58(61) marks Mason and Dixon's 58th horizontal mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning point of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is an original monument, set in 1766, reset at its original site in 1902, is in very good condition, unaltered, and now stands about 12" above ground, ^{firmly in place,} protected by the site and surrounding property owners.

The area here is rural, gently rolling, sparsely settled with occasional farms interspersed with deciduous woodlands. The site is located within Election District 6 of Carroll County and appears to mark the south corner between Manheim and West Manheim Townships in York County, Pennsylvania. It is about 1 mile west southwest of the settlement of Blackrock, PA; about 2 miles east ^{the scattered settlement of} of West Manheim; about 2 miles west of the village of Lineboro, MD-PA; at a point about 2500' southwest of the Glenville Road (LR-66076) at the Amspacher farm lane entrance; about 1200' southwest of their farmhouse, at the southwest edge of an unfenced ^{rectangular} cultivated field, ^{bounded on three sides by woods and is} about 15' into the woods, just short of an old wagon road/woods trail. It is inconspicuous, ^{the site and} protected by a nearby large tree, as well as the property owners.

As with all original Mason and Dixon monuments along the West Line, this stone was quarried and carved in England, of oolitic limestone, cut to stand as a post about 3' above ground and about 1 1/2' rough-cut for securing below ground, measuring about 12" square with a low pyramidal top, embellished with fluting and ^{fluted} margins on all four sides, with ^{fluted} top planes rising to a centered apex. The distinguishing features are the Roman capital letters P facing the north (Pennsylvania) side and M facing the south (Maryland) side, each v-sunk into a shallow plain circle panel. At the time of the 1900-03 Resurvey, this milestone was reset in its original site to stand about 1 1/2' above ground, and now stands about 12" high and somewhat less wide (11 1/2" on the north and south sides; 11 1/2" on the east and west sides). Most embellishments remain and are clear and intact, although there are minor chips at all top corners, nicks along the edges, ^{with some weathering of the top and} a small pit in the apex.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. 58(61) is significant on the federal and state levels primarily as one of the series of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments still standing along their 230.228-mile West Line, the boundary commonly known since Civil War times as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. The site was preliminarily surveyed in 1765 and the milestone set the following year, where ^{in very good condition,} it remains/unaltered to this day, although reset more securely in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of 18 original monuments marking the present Carroll/York county boundary (3 crownstones; 15 milestones), No. 58(61) is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these two counties.


